

Focus on Sudan

Prospects for Culture and Education between destruction and reconstruction

1 December, 10am to 4pm; Haus für Poesie, Kulturbrauerei, Knaackstr. 97, Berlin

According to UNESCO the effect of the ongoing brutal war in Sudan on education, culture, science and communication is disastrous – in addition to the immense humanitarian crisis. 14 out of 19 million school-aged children are currently out of school, cultural heritage and the sciences are severely affected, thousands of objects have been looted or destroyed, including more than 1,800 laboratories, 240 libraries, and 2,500 lecture halls in Sudanese universities. Artists and culture professionals are also severely impacted and over 90% of media outlets had ceased operations.

The German Commission for UNESCO has established a Round Table Sudan in December 2024 to bring together experts and institutions in Germany who are working with or for Sudan within the mandate of UNESCO. The aim of the conference is to streng-then and extend the Sudanese-German network among experts and practitioners, to deepen the awareness of acute needs and to discuss concrete solutions for access to education and culture, for safeguarding heritage and scientific infrastructure. The networks' impact shall be the support of the Sudanese civil society.
